REQUIREMENTS FOR AWARD:

- Applicant must be an American Indian.
- Applicant must attend an accredited educational facility.
- Applicant must be 18 – 35 years of age.
- Applicant must reside in the State of Texas at the time of the application process.
However, the college that the individual attends with the scholarship may be out of State.
- The applicant must have a minimum of a 2.0 (C Average) grade point average in their previous course work. An official report card must be turned in each semester.

THE RECIPIENT WILL:

- Maintain a 2.0 (C Average) grade point average.
- Take a minimum of 12 hours of coursework each semester.
- Be encouraged to test for professional aptitude strengths.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- To apply for the scholarship, each individual must write a 250 word essay on, “How will my degree help the American Indian Community”?
- Include a personal information sheet with their specific tribe information.
- Attach their school transcript(s).
- Provide reference/recommendation letters from 2 of the following:
 - 1.) A Teacher
 - 2.) Community Member
 - 3.) Personal Recommendation
